The nest destination of the visit was Bhilar- the Village of Books. Though a small village, Bhilar is identified and widely recognized as the village of books. We reached there at 1.30 p.m.



The students were surprised to see all the houses converted into libraries. The next reason of astonishment was that the visitors can enter in any house at any time to read the books. This was told to the students by the Project Manager Mr. **Mr. Balaji Halde** and Programme Coordinator **Mr. Rajesh Jadhav** at the Main Office of the project. This project is funded by state government of Maharashtara. The idea, concept and it's implementation was well explained by the project coordinator. Pustakanch Gaav (English: Village of Books) is a special library in Bhilar, Maharashtra that opened on May 4, 2017. The initiative was conceptualized and led by Vinod Tawde, Minister of Cultural Affairs and Marathi Language and inaugurated by Devendra Fadnavis, Ex. Chief Minister of Maharashtra. This government initiative is inspired by Britain's Hay-on-Wye, a notable Welsh town

known for its book stores. At the time of launch, there were 25 artistically decorated locations in Bhilar that are turned into spots for readers; collectively they housed over 15,000 books in 18 distinct genres. Most books were in Marathi language and there were plans to add additional 25,000 books in other languages such as English, Hindi and Gujarati.

Mr. P. S. Kamble thanked the Project Manager and the officials of the Project for guiding the students and providing more information about the village, visits of the outsiders and cooperation of the villagers, the atmosphere of the village, and the visits and appreciation by foreigners, ministers etc. The students as well as teachers visited most of the houses to see the books available and facilities for reading. Each genre of literature and books on different disciplines of knowledge were found in various sections of the village. The students preferred to visit the houses which were loaded with the books on drama, poetry, fiction, comic books etc. The experience was very energetic and motivating for inculcating reading habits among the students. Total **20 students** got benefitted through this activity.





Pratapgad is a large, mountain fort located in Satara district, in the Western Indian state of Maharashtra. The fort is situated on a mountain 24 kilometres from the Mahabaleshwar hill station. The fort is now a popular as a tourist destination. The fort's historical significance is due to the Battle of Pratapgad, which took place here on 10 November 1659, between Shivaji and Bijapur Sultanate general Afzal Khan. Chatrapati Shivaji's killing of Afzal Khan was followed by decisive Maratha victory over the Bijapur army.

The fort stands 1080 metres (3543') above sea level and is built on a spur which overlooks the road between the villages of Par and Kinesvar. The fort has a Tulja Bhawani temple from Shivaji's time. It has murti of goddess Bhawani, which has eight hands (Marathi : Ashtbhuja). Weapons of soldiers are on display near this temple.


We reached Pratapgarh Fort by 3.30 p.m. The student from last year Mr. Yash Kharade and Mr. Shivraj Bhosale narrated the story of Chh. Shivaji Maharaj and Afzal Khan's battle. The way they narrated changed the whole atmosphere and all started visualizing the encounter. Everyone felt proud for being Maharashtrian.

Tracking Pratapgarh was not at all an easy task. Still the students remembered the history of great Marathas learnt during the high school education and headed towards the top. All had a group snaps near the statue of Chh. Shivaji Maharaj. The **20 students** and **05 faculty** enjoyed to look at the natural beauty flora and fauna around Pratapgarh.


