Celebration of World Sparrow Day

World sparrow day is celebrated on 20th March to spread awareness on the importance of conserving sparrows and other birds. The goal of commemorating World Sparrow Day is to utilise it as a platform to emphasise the importance of sparrow conservation as well as urban biodiversity conservation.

The first World Sparrow Day was held on March 10, 2010, and has been celebrated annually since then. Mohammed Dilawar founded The Nature Forever Society to raise awareness about sparrows. In 2008, TIME Magazine named him a conservation hero for his efforts.
