Andaman and Nicobar Islands

Name of State Flower-Andaman Crape Myrtle.

Botanical Name-Lagerstroemia speciosa

Family- Lythraceae.

Common Name- Pride of India, Mota Bondara, Tamhan, Jarul,
Queen of flower



Flowering Season- July- August.

Andaman Crape Myrtle is a large deciduous tree with thin whitish bark. Flowers are many, showy, born in large cylindrical or narrowly pyramidal panicles at branch-end.

Andhra Pradesh

Name of State Flower: Jasmine

Botanical Name: Jasminum sambac

Family: Oleaceae

Common Name: Arabian Jasmine, Sambac Jasmine, Mogra.

Flowering Season: Summer and Rainy season, some varieties bloom throughout the year



It is a small shrub or vine. Flowers produced in clusters of 3 to 12 together at the end of the ends of branches.

These are strongly scented with white corolla.

It is widely cultivated for its attractive and sweetly fragrant flowers.

Flowers are used as a fragrant ingredient in Perfumes and Jasmine tea.

Arunachal Pradesh

State Flower: Fox-tail Orchid.

Botanical Name: Rhynchostylis retusa, L.Family:Orchidaceae

Vernacular Name: Kopou Phool. Common Name: Fox-tail Orchid.

Rhynchostylis is derived from Greek word, rhynchos (= beak) and stylos (= column), meaning beaked-columns in flower retusa' comes from Latin 'retusus', infers to rounded or obtuse lip with tipped.



Flowering: April – September; Fruit Flowering Fruiting: December – May.

Epiphytic herb with stems closely Description enclosed by leaf sheaths. Leaves broadly oblong, Inflorescences racemose, cylindrical, pendulous, dense-flowered appear like a fox-tail. Flowers with sepals and petals white or pink, splashed deep purple; dorsal sepals elliptic; lateral sepals oblique, base adnate to column; lip spathulate, apiculate and retuse at apex pink-white.

ASSAM

Name of the State flower: Fox-tail orchid

Botanical Name: Rhynchostylis retusa (L.) Blume

Family: Orchidaceae

Common Name: Kopou Phul (Assamese); Draupadi Mala (Hindi); Panas Koli (Konkani); Samijirei (Manipuri); Gajra, Seetechi Veni (Marathi).

Etymology: The specific epithet, retusa is referred to its retuse-tipped lip in

flowers.



Flowering & Fruiting: April – May.

The inflorescence is used by Assamese girls to adorn their hair during the spring festival 'Rongali Bihu'. Among the youths of Assam, this orchid is regarded as symbol of love, fertility and merriment.
